"The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God They are corrupt, they have done abominable works; there is none that doeth good" (Ps. 14:1; Ps. 53:1 is almost identical).

"For the wicked boasteth of his heart's desire, and the covetous renounceth, yea contemneth (holds in contempt-BC) Jehovah. The wicked, in the pride of his countenance, saith, He will not require it. All his thoughts are, There is no God" (Ps. 10:3-4).

"The proud and the haughty man, scoffer is his name; he worketh in the arrogance of pride "(Prov. 21:24). "Let no man deceive himself. If any man thinketh that he is wise among you in this world, let him become a fool, that he may become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God" (1 Cor. 3:18-19). "Take heed lest there shall be anyone that maketh spoil of you through his philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ" (Col. 2:8).

**"O** Timothy, guard that which is committed unto thee, turning away from the profane babblings, and oppositions of the knowledge/science which is falsely so-called; which some professing have erred concerning the faith" (1 Tim. 6:20-21).
