Midweek Bible Study

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go into the house of the LORD'" (Psalm 122:1).

Wednesday evenings are difficult on parents and children alike. Americans, like the ancient Romans, go at break-neck speed most of the time. After a long day of school, work, then dinner, homework, and frazzled nerves — who's got time for Bible study?! Plus, it is the **middle** of the week, which means we have two more days of the same for which to prepare. Enough already!

Emily and I remember the stress and strain of raising children in this present world. But we also now experience the *absence* of that responsibility. Our children are grown, gone, and living their own lives. We grew weary of the stress-filled days, but we **never** considered *cutting back on the Lord!* In fact, it was frustrating to me — as a *spiritual* teacher — to see public schools get 40+ hours with our kids while in the church we only got 4!
