- Jesus offered the gift of "living water," John 4:10

- Christ gave "gifts" to the church apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, teachers, Ephesians 4:8
- "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning," James 1:17

The best gifts ever given to the world were given by a benevolent God who is interested in our long-term happiness, safety and security. Do we have enough faith to see this, to appreciate them, and to receive them?

Christians may *gift "gifts"* to God in return, according to the New Testament. The free-will contribution of the saints to those churches in Jerusalem and Judea was called a "*gift,*" 1 Corinthians 16:3; 2 Corinthians 8:4, 19-20; 9:5.

In the Old Testament, the "gifts and sacrifices for sin" were offered through the high priest, Hebrews 5:1; 8:3-4; 9:9.

Abel offered "a more excellent sacrifice" to God because it was done in obedient faith. Thus, God testified of his "gifts" and through them he still speaks to us, though he is dead, Hebrews 11:4.
