- Matthew 5:38 some thought the law implied this.
- Matthew 5:46 love those who love you.
- Matthew 25:25 the one-talent servant gained nothing and lost nothing.

6. The golden rule: do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

- Matthew 5:43-45 so love your enemies and do them good.
- Luke 10:33-35 the good Samaritan: "what's mine is thine; I'll share it."
- Romans 12:17 "Taking thought for things honorable in the sight of all men."

7. The diamond rule: in honor preferring others.

- Genesis 13:8-12 Abraham's offer to Lot.
- Romans 12:10 "in honor preferring one another."
- Philippians 2:3-4 "each counting other better than himself."
