Gifts Tell Us Something

One of those men, the apostle Paul, said that these gifts would accomplish the following: equip the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, until all believers come to the unity of the Faith (vv. 12-13).

You do not read about any of the Lord's local churches being engaged in the many "social gospel" activities churches burden themselves with today. So when did it all change? When men took upon themselves the privilege of changing the Lord's church and its mission into something man enjoyed more.
