sword in their hand" (Psalm 149:5-6). The weapons of our warfare may not be carnal, but they are mighty. We are thankful that our God has furnished us with all the armor and protection we need. That is the power of the implanted word.

COMFORT – *"Remember the word to Your servant, upon which You have caused me to hope. This is my comfort in my affliction, for Your word has given me life"* (Psalm 119:49-50). We will have trials and tribulations. We will have trouble. Thanks be to God for what the Comforter has revealed.

JUDGMENT – *"He is coming to judge the earth. He shall judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with His truth"* (Psalm 96:13). The standards of judgment day are not meant to surprise us. We have that by which we will be judged. We have it now in God's word.

SEED FOR SOWING – *"He who continually goes for weeping, bearing seed for sowing, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him"* (Psalm 126:6). We are thankful that the Lord has supplied us with seed, His word.

The Lord has given us the implanted word. He has supplied us with seed (2 Cor. 9:10). We have 3 options at this point: 1.) Store up the seed; 2.) Eat all the seed, or 3.) Sow the seed. Receiving the seed is good, but if we do not share it with others, our future is inevitably doomed. What do we share? See the list. We cannot only share one aspect of the seed: judgment. We must share it all. We are thankful for the implanted Word. For our sakes, and others, let us share it.
