The following comes from Dee Bowman:

- "Selfishness is seen in man's preference for satisfying his own self with ends that are lower than God intended."
- "Selfishness, which is at the base of nearly all sin and which is the result of inordinate self-esteem, is a problem with which all of us must deal from time to time." (*Christianity Magazine*, *3*(*5*), *2*)
- "Selfishness likes unbridled independence (2 Peter 2:17–20). 'Let me do my own thing,' it cries out. It has regard for others only when they can be used to re-varnish an already too great opinion of itself. Selfishness is pride, but with a mission. It seeks expression in pleasure, recognition, gratification. It is at the root of all sin." (True Love Considerate and Selfless. *Christianity Magazine*, 8(4), 2.)
