The Eternal Word

"Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away" (Matthew 24:35).

It is quite impossible to promise that your *"words"* will never pass away unless you are **eternal** yourself! Man is literally made from the dust of the earth, and is an earthly being in body, experience and understanding. The "second Man" (Jesus) came from heaven to reveal to us all things that God wants us to know about heaven.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (Jn. 1:1). At the end of His earthly ministry, Jesus boldly proclaimed, "Before Abraham was, **I** AM" (Jn. 8:58). It was beyond the Jews' comprehension to know that Jesus of Nazareth, seemingly only a Man, was in fact, equal to God the Father, and thus deserving of the title "I AM." That Name means "the eternally existing one." Because of that quality, Jesus has an eternal Word, and an eternal Kingdom, both of which shall never pass away. They shall stand forever.
