## Weather Hindrances

Only this statement was made from a Roman prison cell where Paul was awaiting execution. It was the **winter** of his life, and it would shortly come to an abrupt end.

Winter symbolizes **death**. All nature dies and remains lifeless under the mighty winds which blow in from the northwest and chill everything with life in it. Trees, shrubs, grass all die. People shiver from the cold and rush to be indoors. Darkness dominates the day, allowing only ten hours of light, leaving fourteen hours of darkness. I hate this fact the most.

Be sure as the winter trudges on that you do not lose that *spiritual spark* and die *spiritually*. Too many take spiritual life for granted and remain in a *chosen* "darkness" where God's Word does not often enough invade the mind. Missing Bible study or worship services may seem like a welcomed "break" to some, but it also carries with it the danger of lethargy and indifference. Be sure that this winter does not leave you indifferent to your relationship with Jesus Christ, and to your responsibilities to Him and to your brethren. Be sure this winter is not your spiritual winter!
