When I was a boy, here are some things I was taught:

- 1. To love and reverence God and to respect His word. (Matthew 22:37 to love God with all the heart, soul and might); 1 John 3:5 this is the love of God that we keep His commandments; Hebrews 12:28 we are to serve God with reverence and godly fear).
- 2. To respect the Bible as the Word of God. (2 Timothy 3:14-17 every Scripture is inspired of God and will furnish the man of God completely unto every good work; 2 Peter 1:20-21 no prophecy of Scripture ever originated with men, but holy men spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit).
- 3. To honor Jesus as the Son of God (Matthew 16:16-17 Peter confessed Jesus to be the Christ, the Son of the living God) and to obey Him (John 14-15 Jesus said, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments"; Hebrews 5:8-9 Jesus is the author of eternal salvation to those who obey Him).
- 4. To put the Lord and spiritual things first (Matthew 6:33 we are to seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness with the promise that the necessities of life will be provided for us; Matthew 10:37 we are to love the LORD more than we love father or mother, brother or sister, wife and children).
- 5. To show respect for my elders by saying, "Ma'am" and "Sir" or "Yes, ma'am," and "Yes, sir, rather than "yeah" and "nah." (1 Peter 5:5 "Likewise, ye younger, be subject unto the elder.")
- 6. To respect the property of others and public property. I was forbidden to deface or destroy that property. Guess who would have to pay to clean or restore or replace it? I would!
- 7. To respect the rights of others and not to be rude, or obnoxious or too noisy (with talk, play or music).
- 8. To be honest and to never lie to or deceive others. (Ephesians 4:25 put away falsehood and speak truth one with another; Colossians 3:9 lie not one to another; Revelation 21:8 among those who will have their part in the lake of fire and brimstone, are all liars).
- 9. To keep my promises or the word that I had given; to fail to do so was much like lying (Ephesians 4:25; Ecclesiastes 5:5-6).
- 10. To pay off my debts and to take care of and return borrowed items to fail to do was the same as stealing.
- 11. To clean up any messes that I had made, to try to correct any wrongs that I had done, and to apologize to those whom I had mistreated.
- 12. To expect others to trust me only if I had proved myself worthy of their trust.
- 13. To be impartial and fair to all, young and old, male and female, rich and poor, educated and illiterate, and of whatever race they were.
- 14. To be grateful to God and man for favors done or blessings bestowed.
- 15. To be compassionate, kind and considerate. To help others who needed any help even my enemies.
- **16.** To be unselfish and to go through life doing things for others rather than expecting others to be always doing things for me.
- 17. To live within my means and not to cultivate desires and tastes that would lead me to think I was better than others or cause me to never be content with what I had.
