Are Christians To Keep The Seventh Day As A Sabbath? {concluded from 342303}

- 8. The seventh-day Sabbath is called, along with "meat," "drink," "feast day," and "new moon," "a shadow of the things to come." All were types of the greater things we have in Christ (Colossians 2:16-17). Out of the sixty New Testament references to the sabbath day, Seventh-Day Adventists say that this is the only one that does not refer to the seventh-day Sabbath. Strange? No, a desperate necessity!
- 9. The seventh-day Sabbath is a part of the old covenant which by Christ was "blotted out," "taken out of the way," "nailed to the cross" (Colossians 2:14-17). We are not to let any one judge us by these things or bind upon us these things. Read 2 Corinthians 3:1-11; the ten commandments written upon tables of stone, including the fourth which concerns the Sabbath day, are part of the old covenant which was a "ministration of death" and which "passed away."
- 10. The seventh-day Sabbath was at least part of the old covenant made by God with Israel and Judah, but God through Christ has made **a new covenant** with Israel and Judah, which is also a covenant with all nations. Read 1 Kings 8:9 21; Jeremiah 31:31-34; Hebrews 8:7-13; the last reference quotes the Jeremiah passages and shows its fulfillment in the new covenant of Christ for all nations.

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
