Aim Of The Course

- In lieu of the above, one may use a laptop computer with proper Bible software

Absences

- Each quarter of the year the disciple is permitted 3 unexcused absences.
- Three unexcused tardies equal one unexcused absence.

Course Procedure

Each disciple of the Lord is expected to participate in all Bible classes and sermons by carefully listening to the lesson, doing homework in advance of the Bible classes and by taking notes of all given sermons.

Bible class participation is both invited and expected on any subject being discussed.

We will assume in this congregation that the Bible is verbally inspired of God and is the final authority on all subjects. Your preacher and teachers firmly believe this and will proceed on the assumption that all disciples recognize the same.
