"Adulterers and adulteresses! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God" James 4:4.

James, the Lord's brother, set forth many fundamental truths in his brief epistle. None of them can be ignored with impunity. Jesus called Paul to be an apostle and sent him to "open their eyes, in order to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who are sanctified by faith in Me" (Acts 26:18).

To the Corinthians Paul wrote: "Come out from among them and be separate, says the Lord. Do not touch what is unclean, and I will receive you" (2 For. 6:17). Our relationship with God as sons and daughters (v. 18) is dependent upon being separate from the world!
