The Christian's Checklist:

"But you have not so learned Christ, if indeed you have heard Him and have been taught by Him, as the truth is in Jesus: that you put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceitful lusts, and be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and that you put on the new man which was created according to God, in true righteousness and holiness." **Ephesians 4:20–24**.

- Put away lying and speak the truth, v. 25.
- Be angry but do not sin, v. 26.
- Don't give in to the Devil, v. 27.
- Do not steal, but work in order to give to others, v. 28.
- Do not use corrupt language, but words that build up others, v. 29.
- Do not grieve the Holy Spirit, v. 30.
- Put away all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, evil-speaking, v. 31.
- Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, and forgiving one another, v. 32.
- Walk in love, as Christ has loved us, 5:2.
- Do not practice fornication, uncleanness or covetousness even once! 5:3
- Do not practice filthiness, foolish talking, coarse jesting, 5:4.

"Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. Therefore do not be partakers with them." **Ephesians 5:6–7**

Read the similar list found in **Colossians 3:5-16**. You can add to the above list from this Scripture the following: **love**, which is the bond of perfection; **forgiving** one another, **peace** and **thankfulness**.
