"Test" (dokimazō): "to test (literally or figuratively); by implication, to approve; ...discern, examine" [Strong's Greek Dictionary]

Dear Christian, have you "examined" and "tested" yourself lately? Some may think they are doing very well because they are a member of a local church, and the leaders of that church have not rebuked, corrected or admonished them. But Paul instructed the Corinthian Christians to examine themselves to see if they were in the faith! Could you and I do that? Objectively? What standard might we use?
