Everything Is Mine!

"For every beast of the forest is Mine, and the cattle on a thousand hills" Psalm 50:10.

Take the time to read **Psalm 50** in its entirety. God's point in **verse 10** is that God owns the universe since He created it. Those who bring sacrifices to Him should not think they are giving Him something He needs. Instead, sacrifices are to make man aware of <u>his</u> deficiencies in contrast to <u>God's</u> perfection!
