King Nebuchadnezzar: Daniel 4 teaches us the magnificent dream that the king had which depicted him as a "great tree" mighty, huge, and world-wide, but which was cut down for a time to teach the lesson that "... the living may know that the Most High rules in the kingdom of men, gives it to whomever He will, and sets over it the lowest of men'" (v. 17). Despite this dream and its interpretation, one year later King Nebuchadnezzar proudly stated: "Is not this great Babylon, that I have built for a royal dwelling by my mighty power and for the honor of my majesty?" (v. 30). — Oops! He spent the next seven years suffering from a mental disease that made him nothing more than an animal! God blessed him with restoration of health, power and influence again.
