Two Extremes

I was watching an interview with Dr. Jeffress, pastor of the First Baptist Church in Dallas, via the internet yesterday. He has been severely criticized in the media for being *anti-semitic* and *anti-gay* because he teaches that everyone must come to Jesus to be saved and that homosexuality is a sin. He has been accused of hate speech by strong leftist media. So I applaud his "conservative stance" on these two issues.

I couldn't believe my ears! How *far left* can even a Baptist go in condoning the Catholic pope! The same Bible condemns the Catholic Church as an apostate organization (2 Thess. 2:1-12) and many of their well-known doctrines *specifically* -- abstaining from marriage and forbidding certain meats (1 Tim. 4:3).
