The Blackness of Darkness

Let me begin by saying that I am still *learning* to appreciate every season of the year, and all is a gift from the wisdom and understanding of God (see Acts 14:15-17). On the average, we receive most of our snowfall in January and February, with the greatest accumulations coming during these months as well. Now that you are probably enjoying this "misery" with me, let's make an application.

If you and I do not like darkness, then we had better do all that we can to avoid hell! The New Testament repeatedly speaks of the black darkness that pervades hell!

"For if God did not spare the angels who sinned, but cast them down to hell and delivered them into **chains of darkness**, to be reserved for judgment;" (2 Pet. 2:4).

"These are wells without water, clouds carried by a tempest, for whom is reserved the blackness of darkness forever" (2 Pet. 2:17). See also Jude 13.

Jesus repeatedly described hell as *"outer darkness"* (Matt. 6:12; 22:13; 25:30). Marvin Vincent explains that in the original language the order of words is very forcible: "They shall be cast forth into the darkness, *the outer* (darkness)." The image is that of thick darkness of night!

Before you dismiss this horrible description, be warned that when men have been placed in solitary confinement in prison for days in a chamber without light, they often suffered severe mental and emotional consequences. Now imagine this being your destination for eternity!!
