Setting Goals for the Year

The Lord has blessed you and me with another new year, and we should spend it wisely, and carefully *one day at a time*. Ask for God to give them wisdom, strength, and courage to do what needs to be done at this time. Nobody living is too old to pray!

Then there is Simeon in Jerusalem, a just and devout man, who was told by God that he would not see death until his eyes beheld the Messiah (Lk. 2:25-32). He prophesied of the salvation Jesus Christ would bring to the world of Jews and Gentiles before he died. He was not too old to tell others about the truth.
