## The Masters

In 1934, the Augusta National Golf Club conducted its first tournament. Bobby Jones, the renowned golfer and co-architect of the golf course, played in that tournament. Eighty-four years later, the Masters is considered one of the four "majors" in golf, and the only one of the four majors to be conducted at the same course every year.
