"Wash Your Hands!"

"Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded" ~ James 4:8.

Pharisees ceremonially cleansed cups and dishes (Matthew 23:26), but forgot to cleanse their hearts and minds! They were a stench in the nostrils of God.

"Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God," 2 Corinthians 7:1. Long after the coronavirus epidemic is over, you and I will be constantly on guard, cleansing ourselves from the polluting, infecting "filthiness" of the flesh and spirit. In this way, we can be fit for the eternal kingdom of God!
