- (2) You have started a race, begun a journey, embarked upon a voyage, 2 Timothy 2:5; Hebrews 12:1-2; Luke 9:62; 2 Timothy 4:8 In this life you are now a sojourner and pilgrim, 1 Peter 2:11-12; 1:17; Hebrews 11:13-14.
- (3) You have been married to Christ in a spiritual union that is to bring forth spiritual fruit, Romans 7:4; 1 Corinthians 11:2; Ephesians 5:23,24,25-27.
- (4) You have enlisted for life as a soldier in the Lord's spiritual army, 1 Timothy 6:12; 2 Timothy 2:3-4; 4:8; Ephesians 6:10-18; 2 Corinthians 10:3-6.

(Please take the time to read all of these passages; they have to do with your eternal destiny.)

Unfortunately, many do not do it right the first time. They are entirely too young and too immature. Or, they are acting impulsively or whimsically (As in "I'll be baptized if you will.")
