✓Stand fast in the Lord, Philippians 4:1

- Perfect, complete, peaceful unity, 1 Corinthians 1:10
- **☑** Comfort in all your tribulations, 2 Corinthians 1:3-4
- **✓** Hope that you are partakers of the consolation, 2 Corinthians 1:7
- **☑** Grace and peace, Galatians 1:3
- Your spiritual eyesight may become greater, Ephesians 1:18
- **☑** Understanding of the Scriptures written by Paul and other inspired men, Ephesians 3:3-4
- Strengthened with might through His spirit in the inner man, Ephesians 3:16
- Comprehension with all the saints the width, length, depth, and height of the love of Christ, Ephesians 3:18-19
- Filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding, Colossians 1:9

Secondly, if **everything** Paul mentioned were true of you and me, then heaven would be absolutely guaranteed! Standing fast in the Lord, we would not waver. An established, mutual faith would mean that both Paul and us would receive the same reward — eternal life, 2 Tim. 4:8.

Thirdly, **perfect unity**, comfort in tribulations, grace and peace, and increased love for the brethren would certainly make for a wonderful relationship with all Christians, especially those with whom we meet regularly!
