Jesus warned us in Matthew 24:4, "Take heed that no one deceives you." And the apostle Paul added to that statement the following: "Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall" (1 Cor. 10:12). We are all far more vulnerable than we think. We tend to be naive, trusting and generous in our dealings with people and issues. So that leaves us vulnerable even if we are honest and sincere.

Some people are deceived into thinking they are wise, when they are maybe just worldly-wise, 1 Cor. 3:18. Some will be deceived into thinking that the unrighteous will inherit heaven! 1 Cor. 6:9. Some will be deceived into thinking that "evil company" does NOT corrupt good habits! 1 Cor. 15:33. But perhaps the most important Scripture on the subject is Galatians 6:7: "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap." Satan would have us believe that any particular sin is beneficial for you, rather than destructive. God warns us not to be so deceived.

"Now the Spirit expressly says that in latter times some will depart from the faith, giving heed to deceiving spirits and doctrines of demons" (1 Timothy 4:1). Be careful, be studious, and be aware!
