f you have a problem, face it and deal with it; but seek the Bible solution to it, and apply that solution.

If a brother has sinned against you, read and apply Matthew 18:15-17. If you have wronged a brother, apply the principle of Matthew 5:23-24. A problem in your marriage? A problem in your family?
