Had he remained in that state of mind, his feelings would have led him to eternal doom.

This is a real problem in our society today. We have adopted THE POSTMODERN MENTALITY that says how I feel is more important than objective facts. But this is not true in things pertaining to God. Listen to Jesus:

"Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven" (Matthew 7:21). The standard of God's approval is "the will of My Father in heaven." Not how I feel about it. Not how you feel about it. Not how our society feels about it. But what God says about it! Jesus further illustrated His point by the well-known "wise man" who built his house upon the "rock" (Matthew 7:24-25). His house stood in the turbulent times that followed. And the "rock" represented "whoever hears these sayings of Mine and does them" (v. 24). Dear reader, consider the importance of what God is telling us today, before it is too late for you.

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
